CURRENT CAPACITY

= 50% childcare access aap

Current childcare access in Milford:

- Based on recent data, there are an estimated <u>71 children</u> ages 0-6, with all parents working outside the home, without access to licensed childcare. Within these spots, there are only <u>2 infant spots</u> for children 6 weeks 18 months of age. The waitlist for these spots exceeds the rate of infancy.
- Seward County as a whole has an estimated 303 child gap.



As our community and county grow, the childcare crisis continues to worsen.

Early Childhood Impact:

 The first three years of life are critical for a child's development.

 Children in Milford deserve stimulating, nurturing, safe, and educational facilities to attend that help ensure future success.

Economic Impact:

 Lack of access to childcare causes businesses to struggle to recruit and retain employees.

 This causes a <u>\$4.3m economic</u> <u>impact</u> on Seward County annually.

Families are choosing to live <u>elsewhere</u> where quality childcare is available.

THE MCLC PLAN

The Milford Childhood Learning Center plans to open a new childcare center to address the gap in access to care.

LOCATION

Bellwood Mennonite
Church has generously
leased use of their land
to build the childcare
center in hopes of pairing it with
their Montessori-accredited
preschool program. MCLC will
modify the SCC modular tech
home as a childcare center
once completed.



GRANT FUNDING

The MCLC applied for and was awarded a \$651k furnishment grant for childcare expansion from DHHS. **Put simply; the state will pay for all the items inside if the community builds the structure on the outside**.



JUNE 2023

Formed the MCLC nonprofit and filed for 501(c)(3) status.
Currently pending mid-fall approval.



MAY 2023

Received land use donation from Bellwood Mennonite Church.




JULY 2023

Received grant allocation in the amount of \$651,732 and LB840 grant funding for \$70,000.

What are your strategies for staffing the center?

The MCLC has a nonprofit business structure. This allows for two staffing strategies:

- The organization will not pay taxes on net earnings, resulting in greater resources for wages.
- The MCLC does not have an 'owner.' All revenues are reinvested into the center.

Our goal for net earnings is to benefit providers, parents, and children.

How many children will the new center hold?

We plan to accommodate 35+ children. MCLC is prioritizing increasing access to infant care in Milford.

Things seem like they are moving fast. Why?

Grant funding has dictated the timeline. The \$651k grant requires us to become licensed and operational by December 31, 2023.
